- 119 **Moulin de Gassac, Chardonnay, Languedoc, France**
Bright and clean, unoaked, notes of pear, peaches and green apple.
- 114 **Landmark Vineyards, "Overlook", Sonoma, California**
Buttery, oaked, notes of marzipan, honeysuckle, toast and vanilla.
- 102 **Stella, Pinot Grigio, Umbria, Italy**
Light and refreshing, hints of apple, honeydew and citrus fruit.
- 104 **Moulin de Gassac, Ros , Syrah-Carignan, Languedoc, France**
Refreshing and balanced, crisp acidity and a hint of minerality.

Hints of peach, pear and green apple.
- 310 **Codorniu, Cava, Brut, Spain**
Crisp and refreshing, made from classic cava grapes.
- 311 **Mionetto, Prosecco, Brut, Italy**
Intense fruity bouquet of golden apples, dry and well balanced.
- 312 **Pommery Pop, Champagne, France**
Beautiful aromas and flavours of apple, orange and lemon. Creamy, clean with fine non persistent bubbles.

- 301 Innocent Bystander, Pink Moscato, Australia (Half Bottle) 375mL**
For a fun starter try this Pink Moscato that has become quite a phenomenon! Fantastically fizzy, this wine shows summer fruits, rose petal and Turkish delight.
- 302 Adami, Prosecco, Italy (Half Bottle) 375ml**
Very delicate and refined, slightly dry with elegant bubbles and a vibrant palate.
- 303 Chateau Chantal "Celebrate", Semi-Dry Sparkling Rosé, Michigan**
Have a little sparkling wine from Michigan and let us show you how a great evening begins!
- 304 Domaine Laurier "Methode Champenoise", Sparkling, California**
"Methode Champenoise" is a technique that results in a more full-bodied and satisfying wine.
- 305 Pierre Gerbais "Cuvee de Reserve", Extra Brut Grower Champagne, Champagne, France**
A great affordable grower champagne! Green apples, ripe pears and buttered bread. Fantastic acidity and length plus generous minerality. 50% Pinot Noir, 25% Chardonnay and 25% Pinot Blanc.
- 306 Veuve Clicquot, Champagne, France**
The first sip delivers freshness and the forcefulness of a well-structured and well-balanced wine that has fruit and spices.
- 307 Chartogne-Taillet, Champagne Cuvee St. Anne, Merfy, France**
A graceful yet sinewy bubbly, exuding whole grain bread, mineral, honey and citrus flavors. Well balanced and on the dry side with a firm structure and a long, mineral and vanilla tinged finish.
- 507 Dom Perignon, Champagne, France, 2006**
Fresh, crystalline and sharp. An aquatic vegetal world with secret touches of white pepper and gardenia with notes of liquorice and dried ginger unfurling to a smooth mellow finish.
- 508 Dom Perignon, Champagne, France, 1992**
Hints of biscuit with citrus zest and black cherry. Impressions of smoked and toasted aromas with a pure and lively finish.
- 509 Dom Perignon, Champagne, France, 1990**
Copper pink color, complex bouquet with exotic combinations of papaya, crystallized orange, curry leaves and sweet spices. Rounded off by marine and roasted notes.

Cellar Selections – Limited Quantity

- 502 Maison Roche de Bellene “Le Charmois”, White Burgundy, Premier Cru, Burgundy, France (2009)**
From the famous Burgundian winemaker Nicolas Potel, who has moved to help run Domaine de Bellene, and has brought all of his Bio-certified vine growers along with him. Potel focuses on old-vine grapes, which have always produced such distinct and great depths of flavor in their fruit. This white Burgundy comes from vines contiguous to Grand Cru vineyards and shows mainly of Ripe Stone and Citrus fruits. There is some minerality with hints of Herbs and Flowers. The nose is delicate, but don't let that fool you, it possesses great mouth-feel; the combination of being smooth, rich and having a long finish.
- 503 Domaine François Buffet, Red Burgundy, Volnay Premier Cru, Burgundy, France (2011)**
Volnay is known for making some of the smoothest, most delicate red wines of the southern Côte d'Or. Since 1962, the Buffet family has been cultivating eight hectares of vines while following ancestral biodynamic traditions based on lunar cycles, and without the use of herbicides, insecticides and additives. Immensely seductive, fruity and lush. Look for aromas of cherry, plum and pomegranate and flavors of black cherry and boysenberry. Not available in US outside of Michigan.
- 504 Château Gigognan, Clos du Roi, Châteauneuf-du-Pape, France (2012)**
The Château is located in one of the driest zones of the Rhone Valley. The Châteauneuf-du-Pape vineyard is located on the Southern part of the estate and benefits from over 2,800 hours of sunshine per year. Aromas of leather earth and small red fruits. Round and unctuous, forward tannins, prunes and cooked fruits. Nicely integrated and complex with a long, spicy finish.
- 505 Cliff Lede, Cabernet Sauvignon, Stag's Leap District, California (2013)**
Establishing his winery in 2002, Cliff Lede along with his winemaker Chris Tynan have come together to form an unrivaled team, making some of the most remarkable wines in the Stag's Leap District. The hand harvested fruit was sourced from the hillside terraces of their Poetry Vineyard plot as well as their Twin Peaks Estate in the Stag's Leap District. The unique combination of soil types representing both ancient riverbed alluvial soils and rocky terraces that are volcanic in nature, translates into a wine of impressive complexity. Exceptionally balanced with concentrated ripe fruit, complemented by bright acidity and supple yet intense structure. Enticing aromas of crushed blackberries and cassis are accented by dark chocolate, black licorice, cocoa powder and espresso adding sophistication to this opulent wine. 78% Cabernet Sauvignon, 8% Petit Verdot, 6% Cabernet Franc, 5% Malbec, and 3% Merlot.
- 506 Marchesi Biscardo, Amarone Della Valpolicella, Veneto, Italy (2010)**
This Beautiful and masculine wine will Envelope you in great Pleasure and, with much of a Playful Tease, slowly reveal different notes as each glass is poured. Highly refined, it starts from the Spicy, Earthy aromas to the Ripe, deep Cherry, Cassis and prune flavors. A combination of Power and Complexity in a formidable full-bodied style, leather and chocolate that echoes through, accented by orange peel. This bottle will have you yearning to savor the flavors; to further have it linger on your tongue so you can analyze it's soulfulness, while also making you anxious to continue the journey and take that next exciting sip.
- 501 Isole E Olena “Ceparello” Super Tuscan, Tuscany, Italy (2012)**
Paolo Di Marchi, the patriarch of Isole e Olena Vineyards and Winery, has established his “Ceparello” wine as one of the most sought after Super Tuscan wines from the Chianti region. Super Tuscans are so called due to their non compliance to what many Chianti region wine makers consider overly narrow and limiting Chianti Region rules for qualification as a "Chianti" wine. So many of the Super Tuscan wines are blended varietals that do not conform to the rules. Ceparello's composition of 100% Sangiovese grapes also does not conform to those same rules but it is perhaps one of the most unique Super Tuscan wines as a result. Beyond just glowing recognition in Italy, 'Ceparello' has consistently each year been awarded well above 90 points from both Wine Spectator and Robert Parker. It attained such cult status as to be shown on the cover of Decanter magazine and rated as one of Italy's 50 greatest ever wines. Intense bright ruby color with a complex bouquet ranging from floral to wild berries and spice. The palate reveals red cherries and soft tannins with a complex and savory acidity.

White Wine

Chardonnay

- 114 **Landmark Vineyards, "Overlook", Sonoma, California**
Buttery, oaked, notes of marzipan, honeysuckle, toast and vanilla.
- 119 **Moulin de Gassac, Chardonnay, Languedoc, France**
Bright and clean, unoaked, notes of pear, peaches and green apple.
- 121 **Bennett Family "Reserve", Russian River, California (2014)**
A luscious, mouth filling wine is evident in the first taste; that of roasted grain with crème brulee follow the stone fruit aromas. Nice persistent finish.
- 107 **Sonoma-Cutrer "Russian River Ranches", Sonoma Valley, California (2014)**
This wine will expand in the glass, offering up grapefruit, lemon, pear and kumquat with subtle vanilla bean and herbal mushroom.
- 123 **Cakebread Cellars, Napa Valley, California (2012)**
On the palate this wine is rich and concentrated with ripe apple and pear flavors. Citrus and mineral tones emerge in the long, crisp finish.
- 105 **Novellum, Languedoc, France**
One of Eric Solomon's selections, this unique unoaked chardonnay is aged on the lees of viognier. It is full and ripe, hinting of tropical fruit and gives elusive fragrance.
- 103 **Chateau de Chamilly, "Les Jardins", Premier Cru, Montagny, Burgundy, France (2013)**
Oaked Burgundy with a silky mouthfeel and vibrant notes of peach, lychee and mirabelle. Crisp acidity and minerality.
- 118 **Jean Touzot, "Vielles Vignes", Macon – Villages, Burgundy, France**
Lively, crisp, juicy and persistent. Green apple, citrus and melon chardonnay fruit underpinned by soft minerality.
- 502 **Maison Roche de Bellene "Le Charmois", Premier Cru, Burgundy, France (2009)**
Ripe stone and citrus fruits. Some minerality with hints of herbs and flowers. Rich and smooth with a long finish.

White Wine (continued)

Sauvignon Blanc

- 106 **Kim Crawford, Marlborough, New Zealand**
Subtle aroma of licorice and flowers. Lush, round and sweet, with moderate intensity and good texture to its slightly herbaceous flavors. A fairly full, soft style.
- 120 **Domaine Gitton, "Clos Joanne D'Orion", Pouilly-Fume, Loire Valley, France (2014)**
Round and luscious, aromas of violet, honey and orange blossom lead to tangerine and grapefruit with a chalky minerality.
- 116 **Château de Sours, "La Fleur d'Amelie Blanc", Bordeaux, France**
Aromas of honeysuckle, passion fruit, pineapple and vanilla.

Additional Whites/ Rosé

- 102 **Stella, Pinot Grigio, Umbria, Italy**
Light and refreshing. A Pinot Grigio that is fruit-forward with apples, honeydew and citrus fruit.
- 104 **Moulin de Gassac, Rosé, Syrah-Carignan, Languedoc, France**
Refreshing and balanced, crisp acidity and a hint of minerality.
- 113 **Peninsula Cellars, Semi-Dry Riesling, Michigan**
Sweet blossom aromas and tropical fruit flavors accented with semi-dry sweetness.
- 115 **Fenn Valley, Dry Riesling, Michigan**
Crisp dry, fermented in stainless steel, floral nose with distinct peach and apricot flavors.
- 108 **Moscato Bella, Moscato, California**
Crisp with a subtle sweetness, flavors of apricot, honeysuckle, flower blossom and green apple.
- 124 **Jackson-Triggs, Vidal Ice Wine, Niagara Peninsula, Canada (187ml)**
Liquid gold with beautiful tropical notes, great viscosity with extremely generous finish that lingers.

Red Wine

Pinot Noir

- 200 **Coastal Vines, Sonoma, California**
A smooth and very soft Pinot that has cherry notes with a touch of vanilla.
- 206 **Gitton Père et fils "Taureau Rouge, Coteaux de Giennois, Loire Valley, France**
Cranberry and vibrant acidity highlight this mineral driven, small production Pinot Noir.
- 217 **Sass Winery, Estate Grown, Willamette Valley, Oregon (2014)**
Big but elegant, dark fruit with red cherry brightness, white pepper and truffled earth. Fine tannin, silky.
- 221 **Maison Roche de Bellene "Vieilles Vignes", Burgundy, France (2014)**
Rich, Silky and full of black cherry, offering a lovely harmony and lingering finish of earth and mineral. From the famous Nicolas Potel, this is a pinot lover's delight.
- 204 **Domaine Moutard – Diligent, "Irancy", Burgundy, France (2009)**
Bright and refined structure, refreshing pear, apple and citrus flavors against hints of spice and toasted bread.
- 503 **Domaine François Buffet, Single Vineyard Volnay Premier Cru, Burgundy, France (2011)**
Fruity and lush. Aromas of cherry, plum and pomegranate and flavors of black cherry and boysenberry.

Cabernet Sauvignon

- 210 **Gougenheim, Valle Escondido, Mendoza, Argentina**
Classic with black fruits, spices and vanilla scented oak. Aged for 4 months in French oak, long finish.
- 209 **Justin, Paso Robles, California (2014)**
Full bodied with black cherry and black current jam. Baking spice, dried leaf and sweet tobacco. Aged 14 months in new American oak.
- 205 **Ferrari-Carano, Alexander Valley, California (2013)**
With aromas of blackberry syrup, boysenberry, spicy black currant, espresso and caramel, this wine delights with rich, delicious flavors of Bing cherry, chocolate, toffee and anise.
- 222 **Stag's Leap Cellars "Artemis", Napa, California (2013)**
The infamous Stag's Leap Cellars! Known to put Napa (or American wines in general!) on the map for Cabernet; in a time period where the wine world was dominated by the French. This wine is full-bodied and has a rich finish.
- 214 **Penley Estates, Coonawarra, Australia (2013)**
A more elegant Cabernet, this wine shows dominance of spicy cabernet fruit, a dense ripeness with hints of smoky oak and grape tannin.
- 505 **Cliff Lede, Stag's Leap District, California (2013)**
An opulent wine. Aromas of crushed blackberries and cassis accented by dark chocolate, black licorice, cocoa powder and espresso.

Red Wine (continued)

Additional Reds

- 223 **Luna Vineyards, Merlot, Napa, California (2010)**
The palate is a lush mixture of black raspberries, cassis and sweet tobacco. Enjoy this wine slowly as it will relax and reveal hidden treasures.
- 225 **Altos "Las Hormigas", Malbec, Mendoza, Argentina**
Essence of wild cherry, red berries, anise and tropical spices. Try it in place of a Cabernet!
- 218 **Château Recougne, Bordeaux-Superieur (2011)**
Liberally toasty with notes of espresso and spice, as well as red currant, black cherry and plum.
- 215 **Château des Karantes, "Bergerie Rouge", Languedoc-Roussillon, France**
Well balanced blend of syrah, Grenache and Mourvèdre. Fruity with aromas of strawberry and cherry.
- 002 **Fenn Valley, Capriccio, Michigan**
Chambourcin, merlot and cabernet franc blend. Big soft red with jammy berry fruit flavor balanced with dryness.
- 207 **Torbreck "Woodcutter's Shiraz", Shiraz, Barossa Valley, Australia (2014)**
Wine made with inspiration from the Rhone Valley of France. Constantly praised for being succulent and rich, the best feature of this wine is its complexity and texture.
- 213 **D'arenberg "The Dead Arm", Shiraz, McLaren Vale, Australia (2012)**
Dead Arm is a vine disease that ultimately causes loss of one half, or an 'arm' of the vine, but the grapes that are growing on the other side, while low yielding, display amazing intensity.
- 208 **Pietra Santa, Zinfandel, Cienega Valley, California**
A medium-bodied, bold and earthy Zinfandel. The wines produced hold distinct minerality characters, due to unique soil conditions possessing limestone and shale.
- 219 **Di Majo Norante, Sangiovese, Molise, Italy**
A mellow Sangiovese that has a fresh and fruity bouquet with a hint of violet, red berries and a trace of leather.
- 216 **Guigal, Côtes du Rhône, Rhone Valley, France**
A nose in intense with fresh fruits with red berries and spices, with a palate that is round and racy.
- 212 **Château des Karantes, "La Clape", Languedoc-Roussillon, France (2011)**
This small production wine is a blend of Grenache, Syrah and Mourvedre. Strong aromas of blackberries, plums, lavender and spices hit you first before dark fruit unfolds on the palate alongside bittersweet chocolate. Big, but silky and very satisfying.
- 504 **Château Gigognan, "Clos du Roi", Châteauneuf-du-Pape, France (2012)**
Rich ripe red fruits and vanilla with firm tannins. A perfect bridge between new world and old world styles. 70% Grenache, 30% Syrah.
- 506 **Marchesi Biscardo, Amarone Della Valpolicella, Veneto, Italy (2010)**
Highly refined. From spicy, earthy aromas to ripe deep cherry, cassis and prune flavor. Leather, chocolate and orange peel echoes through.
- 501 **Isole E Olena "Ceparello" Super Tuscan, Tuscany, Italy (2012)**
Intense, bright ruby color with a complex bouquet ranging from floral to wild berries and spice. The palate reveals red cherries and soft tannins with a complex and savor acidity.
